FORWARD

We are pleased to present the second issue of the Annual Report on Port State Control in the Mediterranean Region. This annual report outlines recent activities & general introduction to the developments in the region with statistical port State inspection data conducted by the member Authorities of Med MoU in the year 2006.

The Member Authorities of the Med MoU are committed to achieve the objectives of improving maritime safety, working and living conditions as well as the protection of the marine environment. They are also committed to face the new set of challenges to ensure ship and port facility security. Taking lead from the Declaration at the end of the First Joint Working Session of the Committees of Black Sea MoU and Med MoU on Port State Control, the Committee decided to take steps towards furthering the co-operation with other MOUs in general and Paris and Black Sea MoU in particular.

This annual report highlights activities and developments of port State control in the Mediterranean region during the year for review. As usual, the report also provides tables and figures of statistics and analysis summarizing the results of port State inspections conducted by member Authorities in 2006.

The Med MoU will further improve and harmonize Port State Control activities in the region and continue to co-operate with parties concerned so as to eradicate operation of substandard ships in the region.

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OVERVIEW

General Introduction:

This Annual Report on port State control in the Med MoU region is published under the auspices of the port State control committee of the Memorandum of understanding on port State control in the Mediterranean Region (Med MoU). This annual report is the second issue and covers port State control activities and developments in the year 2006.

In accordance with the provisions of the Memorandum, the Authorities which have signed and formally accepted the Memorandum or which have been accepted with unanimous consent of the port State control committee would become full members currently; the Memorandum has 10 full members namely: Algeria, Cyprus, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Malta, Morocco, Tunisia and Turkey.

The Port State Control Committee established under the Memorandum Monitors and controls the implementation and on-going operation of the Memorandum.

The Committee consists of representatives of the member Authorities and also observers from the maritime Authorities and the inter-governmental organizations which have been granted observer status by the committee, namely: International Maritime Organization (IMO), International Labour Organization (ILO), Paris MoU and the Black Sea MoU. The Secretariat of the Memorandum is located in Alexandria, Egypt.

For the purpose of the Memorandum, the following instruments are the basis for Port State Control activities in the region:

- * The International Convention on Load Lines, 1966;
- * The International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea, 1974 (SOLAS 74);
- * The Protocol of 1978 relating to the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea, 1974;
- * The International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships, 1973, as modified by the Protocol of 1978 relating thereto (MARPOL 73/78);
- * The International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watch keeping for Seafarers, 1978 (STCW 78);
- * The Convention on the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea, 1972;
- * The Merchant Shipping (Minimum Standards) Convention, 1976 (ILO Convention No. 147);



REVIEW OF YEAR 2006

For inter-regional co-operation on port State control, Med MoU had established good relationship with other MoUs, in particular the Paris MoU and Black Sea MoU.

The first joint Working Session of the port State control committee of the Mediterranean and the Black Sea MoU was held in Istanbul, 20th April 2006. The first joint session opened under the Chairmanship of the Senior Chairman Mr. Lino VASSALO (Malta).

The meeting was attended by the representatives of the member Authorities of the Black Sea MoU: Bulgaria, Georgia, Romania, the Russian Federation, Turkey and Ukraine. The Med MoU Member Authorities: Algeria, Cyprus, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Malta, Morocco, Tunisia and Turkey; chairman of the IMO Maritime Safety Committee (MSC) Mr. Igor Ponomarev (Russian Federation) and observers from Italy, Spain, Republic of Moldova, the International Maritime Organization, the United States Coast Guard, the Secretariat of the Paris Memorandum of Understanding (Paris MoU) the West and Central Africa Memorandum of Understanding (Abuja- MoU) and the Black Sea Commission.

Port State Control Committee

The Eighth Committee Meeting was held from 17th April - 20th April 2006. Delegations from the Maritime Administrations of the all Med MoU Member States attended the meeting along with representatives from IMO, REMPEC, Paris MoU, Black Sea MoU, West & Central Africa MoU, U.S. Coast Guard, Italy and Spain participated as observers.

Moreover, the Committee made discussions and decisions regarding the following:

- The Committee noted with appreciation the signed Agreement of Co-operation between the IMO and the Med MoU on PSC and approved the participation of the Secretariat to the IMO Meetings as IGO and in particular its participation to the flag state sub- Committee Meetings.
- The Committee noted the progress of the Med MoU IC and decided to hold a Working Group meeting for Data base manager in October 2006 at Casablanca before the Committee Meeting in November 2006.



- The Committee instructed the Information Centre to prepare a study concerning to the co-operation with Equasis to be presented to the next Meeting.
- The Committee has noted with confirmation the planning proposal for the PSC's exchange programme between the Med MoU and the Black Sea MoU.

The Committee noted with appreciation the development and progress of the Turkish Port State Control.

The Committee noted also with appreciation the establishment of the Egyptian PSC regime starting from the 1st of July 2005.

The First Joint Working Session of the Committee of the Med MoU and Black Sea was held on the 20th of April 2006 under the Chairmanship of the senior Chairman Mr Lino VASSALO (Malta) and the representatives of the Joint Session agreed upon the Black Sea MoU and the Mediterranean PSC Declaration.

The Ninth Committee Meeting (1st extra ordinary) was held from 27th November till 28^h November 2006 in Istanbul – Turkey.

The meeting was attended by representatives of the member Authorities of Cyprus, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Malta, Morocco, Tunisia Turkey, IMO, Black Sea MoU, West & Central Africa MoU, Riyadh MoU and the Vina del Mar Agreement.


The Committee has approved the following:

- The Committee approved the Riyadh MoU Agreement with the Med MoU Information Center.
- The Committee agreed the use of new acronyms for
 - 1- CIMED for Med. MoU Information Centre
 - 2- MEDSIS for Mediterranean Sea information system
- The Committee has approved to officially launch the Public Website by the 7th of March 2007(Anniversary Data of Launching MEDSIS)
- The Committee has approved the DBMWG02 to be held 3months before the committee meeting in 2008.
- The Committee approved to establish the Management advisory Meeting.

The Tenth Session of the Port State Control meeting will be held during the period from September till November 2007.

MED MOU COMUTERIZED INFORMATION SYSTEM

For reporting and storing port State inspection results and facilitating exchange of information in the region, a computerized database system, the Med MoU Computerized Information System (MEDSIS), has been established. Access to MEDSIS Application for all users is through the address

Immediately prior to the 9th Committee Meeting (1st extra ordinary), **the first Med MoU Data Base Managers working group (DBM)** was conducted on 30-31 October 2006 at Casablanca, Morocco. The 1st session of DBM was chaired by Mr. Mohamed MARZAGUI, Head of Moroccan Delegation

Among other things, the major issues deliberated and considered by the DBM Meeting include:

- detailed statistics on PSC;
- Using MedEA application;
- information exchange with other MOUs;
- comparison study with other MOUs;
- Updating and upgrading of MedEA Information system;
- Med MoU public web site
- Exchange data with Lloyd's Register Fairplay.

The outcome of proceeding of the DBM meeting was reported to the Committee, together with recommendations and suggestions on the matters concerned.

TRAINING

MED MOU-BLACK SEA MOU PSCO EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

Based upon Maritime Authorities submission of proposals for both receiving and sending PSCOs, both Secretariat prepared coordinated 2007 PSCO Exchange programme and circulated it to the Maritime Authorities for confirmation.

CO-OPERATION WITH OTHER REGIONAL PORT STATE CONTROL AGREEMENTS

From an international perspective, establishment of regional port State control co-operation has been widely accepted as an effective measure to combat substandard ships on a global basis.

IMO approved granting IGO status to the Med MoU and other seven MOUs. Participation by PSC regimes at IMO meetings would facilitate deliberation on PSC related matters and benefit constructive between flag and port States.

Med MoU has established and maintained effective and close co-operation with Paris and Black Sea MoU at the administrative and the technical levels.



MED MOU SECRETARIAT

The Mediterranean Memorandum of Understanding Secretariat is based at Alexandria in Egypt. The Secretariat is governed by and accountable to the Committee of the MED MOU on Port State Control. It services the Committee meeting and assists the Committee in its activities.



Detentions in % of inspections








Number of inspections with deficiencies




Number of detention






MoU inspection %


MoU's effort / member Comparison



Number of inspections By Country : / For 2006






Number of Inspection per major Ship type


Number of detention per major Ship type




Number of deficiencies per major Ship type
